Internships

Safe Children and Strong Families Internship Program

Crisis Nursery serves as a placement site for those needing to complete internships and practicums. Interns work in our Safe Children and Strong Families programs, helping us provide care for children, conduct home visits, facilitate parent-child interaction groups and support groups, and teach parent-education classes. Interns may also work with our administrative staff, assisting with fundraising and special events, grant writing, and program outreach. Specific duties assigned vary based on intern skills and academic requirements.

Interns are typically expected to commit to at least 15 hours a week.

Volunteer Projects

Safe Children Program Volunteer

Work directly with childcare staff and children, providing emotional and physical support while creating a safe environment for children to express their feelings and emotions

Strong Families Program Volunteer

Work with our Family Specialists during Parent Child interaction groups or support groups.

House Volunteer

Support the nursery by maintaining a sanitary and organized environment. Keeping our facility clean and organized helps us to use our resources more efficiently and maintain a healthy environment for children we serve. Administrative Volunteer

Maintenance Volunteer

Work on an on-call basis to fix minor in-house issues.

Special Events Volunteer

Assist during fundraising events through the year. Help with events such as the annual Dinner & Auction, Children's Holiday Shop, and football concessions.

To get involved, volunteers should submit a volunteer application and complete required paperwork as necessary. After submitting your application, you will receive an email with more information about volunteering and paperwork that needs to be completed before scheduling an orientation. Attend a Crisis Nursery orientation. At orientation you will meet with Jill to turn in your paperwork, tour the Nursery and learn more about our program, watch a volunteer training video, and complete paperwork to authorize a background check through DCFS (a requirement of all volunteers).

At orientation, you will receive directions on how to get fingerprinted free-of-charge for the background check. This must be completed before scheduling your first volunteer shift. Once fingerprinted, contact Jill to set up your volunteer shift. Fingerprint receipt must be submitted to Crisis Nursery before volunteering begins.

Turn in all paperwork within one month of your first volunteer shift (this includes a TB test, physical and references).
