ECIRMAC (also known as the Refugee Center) exists to provide services essential to refugee and immigrant resettlement in East-Central Illinois and to aid in the exchange and preservation of their respective cultures. History

The East Central Illinois Refugee Mutual Assistance Center (also known as ECIRMAC, or the Refugee Center) was created in 1980 by Vietnamese refugees as a way to help other newly arrived refugees acclimate to American culture, and to provide services commonly needed by this population. Since then, the Refugee Center has expanded its scope to assist all refugees, immigrants, and political asylees, regardless of country of origin. The Center currently has the capacity to provide services in seven languages, including: English, Spanish, French, Vietnamese, Russian, Cantonese, and Mandarin.
