Incumbent Worker Training

Incumbent Worker Training (IWT) can help qualifying companies upskill current workers to be more competitive. IWT improves productivity, creates new revenue streams, and improves retention of valued employees.

- Employer must be in a target sector and training must be job specific
- Minimum training cost of \$2500 and employers are required to match a percentage of the training cost.
