#### PUBLIC SAFETY DEPARTMENT - RESOLUTION AND OATH OF OFFICE

In accordance with the Illinois Compiled Statutes, the Board of Trustees is empowered to appoint sworn members to the College's Public Safety Department. Erik Combs was appointed to the full-time, 12-month public safety officer position, filling the vacancy created by Somphon Penland's transfer.

#### REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT OF PCA

Adam Karch, President of PCA, noted that he is excited for a new year with new faculty representing as senators and a lot of new people serving on committees.

#### **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

Dr. Pamela Lau reported on the following:

- 1. **Legislative Breakfast January 9:** Many elected officials at the federal, state, and municipal levels attended or sent representatives from their offices. There was genuine interest in and support for Parkland and our initiatives to engage the community in learning and be on the forefront of workforce development. Thanked Trustees Ayers, Clem, Ragsdale, and Chair Voyles for coming out to support us, and VP Stephanie Stuart for her excellent work in putting this breakfast together. We plan to bring the legislative breakfast back as an annual event.
- 2. White House's Advanced Manufacturing Workforce Sprint webinar January 11: Aimee Densmore, our CTE program manager for workforce partnerships, was invited to participate in a national panel on training more people for advanced manufacturing as part of the White House's Advanced Manufacturing Workforce Sprint. The program was hosted by Jobs for the Future (JFF). It opened with JFF CEO Maria Flynn in conversation with Neera Tanden of the White House Domestic Policy Council. The panel followed. It was moderated by Brendan Danahar from the National Economic Council at the White House with Aimee from Parkland and a representative from AFL-CIO as panelists. Aimee did a splendid job representing Parkland. She spoke from her frontline experience in working directly with employers, especially in the area of setting up apprenticeships and advising students on their academic options as they pursue career pathways. She knocked every question out of the ballpark with to-the-point answers. She helped to put Parkland in the spotlight as these nationwide conversations are taking place. Congratulated Aimee for a job very well done and thanked trustees who had opportunity within their day to view the webinar. This webinar may also be viewed on YouTube.
- 3. MLK Countywide Celebration January 14: Every year, Parkland joins the cities of Champaign and Urbana, the Village of Rantoul, and the University of Illinois in hosting a countywide celebration honoring the life and legacy of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Dr. Lau participated on behalf of the college in reading the proclamation. Several Parkland people were in the choir: retired counselor Donna Tanner Harold; counselor Joe Omo-Osagie; and business faculty member Ashley Davis. It was a meaningful celebration and a reminder that more needs to be done to fulfill Dr. King's dream.
  - **Rice Repack MLK Day of Service January 15:** The college traditionally marks MLK Day as a Day of Service. This year, as in previous years, many of us braved the cold and came out to partner with the Wesley Food Pantry. We repacked 1250 lbs. of rice into 20 oz bags in two hours of teamwork. The Wesley Food Pantry at Parkland is located in M-138 and is open to the public on Wednesday afternoons every week and the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday mornings each month. Twenty-eight percent of the families served come through the Parkland pantry.

- 4. Career Guide: The CTE division in collaboration with EFE 330 has produced a Career Guide for high school guidance counselors, students, and their families. Thanks to the board for approving the funds to do so. A copy of the guide was provided. Vice President Nancy Sutton updated that the guide will be shared with all the high schools, advisors are using it, and we will start to develop individual pathway guidelines for each of the high schools within all of the career areas.
- 5. **Spring Semester Enrollment:** We are seeing a positive trend in enrollment when pegged against spring 2023 headcount and FTE numbers. As of this morning, we are up 6.7% in headcount and 3.9% in FTE. We are glad to see the students come back. Behind these good numbers is a lot of student-focused, innovative, and sheer hard work from marketing, advising, faculty, employer outreach, and high school career pathways.
- 6. **Dr/ Trame update on keylock project.** Trustees received their new badges and are encouraged to wear them as a sense of identification to employees and students. The badges will serve as employee keys and employees are encouraged to wear to make it a friendly and welcoming environment. This wing will go live later this month and we already have a few soft launches. He noted that Bodine Electric has been a great partner, Jim Bustard has helped lead the physical aspects of the project, and we have a great team helping with programing. We hope to be live with most of campus by end of July.

#### **FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

Mr. Dave Donsbach updated that the financial statements for November reflect the results of operations of the College for the first six months of fiscal year 2024. The revised budget estimates indicate that expenses will exceed revenues by \$344,803.

- The key factors for the College's operating results in FY2024 will be tuition & fee revenues (enrollment), CPPRT revenues, and self-funded health claims' expenses.
- The FY2024 audited beginning operating fund balance is \$41.2M. This amount is 66% of current budgeted operating expenditures.
- TheFY2024 final budget projected a \$43,429 surplus.
- The FY2024 College tentative budget was lodged in July.
- The FY2024 College final budget was approved in September.
- The FY2023 College audit was approved in October.
- The TY2023 tax levy was approved in November.

- The budget workshop will be presented in February.

#### EXEMPT PURCHASE- PHYSICAL PLANT SKID LOADER

The Physical Plant Department is looking to purchase a used 2020 Case SR240 skid loader to replace two 4410 John Deere compact tractors currently used for snow removal and salting. The current tractors are 25+ years old and have heavy corrosion damage. The skid loader will be used for snow removal along with salt, mulch, rock, and dirt loading. Additionally, the variety of quick detach implements compatible with the skid loader will allow the Physical Plant to rent attachments for special needs or projects without having to purchase additional equipment.

The Physical Plant has researched available used and new options from area implement dealers, rental outlets, and online retailers and found the quote from Birkey's Farm Store to be the best option based on the price, condition, and availability. Staff from the College's Diesel Technology program have also reviewed the quote for the skid loader to confirm the value of the purchase.

The purchase relates to the following strategic goals:

Goal E: Secure our Future: Parkland College will strive for sustainable fiscal vitality emphasizing a continued investment in the human, technological, physical, and virtual assets of the college.

**E4:** Maintain sustainable resources and maximize efficiency to support the learning mission of the college.

Administration recommended purchasing a used 2020 Case SR240 Skid Loader from Birkey's Farm Store of Gibson City, IL, for a total cost of \$44,000. This item is exempt from formal bid requirements per the Illinois Public Community College Act section 805/3-27 (k) contracts for goods or services procured from another governmental agency. Board authorization is requested since the cost exceeds \$20,000. Funds are available from FY2024 operating budget for this purchase.

It was moved by Ms. Ragsdale and seconded by Mr. Trimble to approve the purchase of a 2020 Case SR240 Skid Loader from Birkey's Farm Store of Gibson City, IL for a total cost of \$44,000.

Trustee Clem acknowledged the challenging work of pulling together all the components of the key project, noting that there is a lot of difficulty involved in coordinating the work between all the contractors and manufacturers and ensuring that it all works.

Trustee Ayers noted that there are some ID cards that have students credentials and transcript information linked so the information is always available from their ID card. Dr. Trame added that some states have a statewide system with this repository built in, but is not something Parkland is thinking about at this time.

### IX. BUSINESS & FINANCE—Item D

#### EXEMPT PURCHASE – ALEKS TESTING UNITS

The Parkland College Assessment Center uses the ALEKS PPL testing system to determine developmental and college-level placements based on the placement scores. ALEKS results also determine high school students' eligibility for dual credit courses.

McGraw-Hill Global Education Holdings LLC of Blacklick, OH is the sole developer, distributor, and owner of the ALEKS PPL and units used by Parkland College for math placement testing must be purchased directly from them. The unit price is the same for all public Illinois community colleges. The estimated annual usage is 4,000 units at \$15.00 per unit for a total cost of \$60,000.

This purchase relates to the following Strategic Goals:

Goal A: Empower Our Students: Parkland College will empower all students for success.

1. Develop clear evidence-based pathways for success so that students start right, maintain progress, and complete a credential in a timely manner.

Administration recommends purchasing the ALEKS PPL testing units from McGraw-Hill of Blacklick, OH for a total cost not to exceed \$60,000. These items are exempt from formal bid requirement per the Illinois Community College Act, Section 805/3-27.1 (l), contracts for goods or services which are economically procurable from only one source, such as for the purchase of magazines, books, periodicals, pamphlets, and reports, and for utility services such as water, light, heat, telephone, or telegraph. Board authorization is requested since the cost exceeds \$20,000. Funds are available from the FY 2024 and FY 2025 operating budgets.

MOTION – Move to approve the purchase of ALEKS PPL testing units from McGraw-Hill Global Education Holdings LLC of Blacklick, OH, for a total cost not to exceed \$60.000.

· A concise explanation/rationale for the changes:

Changes in accreditation expectations and ICCB requirements identified a need for consistency, standardization, and documentation in course syllabi. In 2019, a faculty committee selected a template for a standard syllabus and a several year process followed to develop the template, integrate it with existing databases and software platforms, and train faculty on the use of the template. The use of the template requires amending the policy to support the use of an electronic syllabus (where a paper one was previously possible) and to clarify administrative responsibility for maintaining the template, keeping it current with state and federal requirements, as well as to clarify faculty responsibility in using the template.

#### 5.01.02 Course Syllabus

During the first week of class, instructors will provide students with a course syllabus (printed or electronic). using the College's syllabus system.

#### Procedure

The syllabus will contain the following-information required by state, federal, and accrediting bodies: as well as information included in the College's syllabus system intended to increase opportunities for, student success.—The office of the Vice President for Academic Services will ensure that general college information in the syllabus system is updated on a semester basis and that the system template is in compliance with state, federal, and accrediting agencies.—Faculty will be responsible for updating specific section information identified in the system template each semester.—Information faculty are responsible for providing includes, but may not be limited to:

- 1. Faculty member's name, office location, office hours, Parkland email address, and office telephone number.
- 2. Course description.
- 3. Required text and materials.
- 4. Highlights of course-specific and General Education learning outcomes (from the Course Information Form).
- 5. 2. Grading, attendance, and make-up policies.
- 6. Consequences for academic dishonesty.
- 7. 3. Approximate amount of time to be spent on each topic, both in-class and outside of class. (course schedule).
- 4. A course schedule, at least weekly, indicating topics or activities to be covered.
- 8. Location of the Parkland College general syllabus.
- 9. Legally required statements as provided by the Vice President for Academic Services When applicable, the syllabus will also include or link to:
- 1. Course prerequisite(s).
- 2.5. Optional books or additional required materials and the costs.
- 3.6. Laboratory information.
- 4. 7. Required writing and/or projects.
- 5.8. Quiz/examination information and schedule.
- 6. 9. Any other requirements, rules, or expectations online and in-class, e.g., penalties for late work, term paper requirements, student-teacher conferences, or classroom behavior expectations... etc.

#### POLICY 5.10 FINAL EXAMINATION REQUIREMENT AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION

Students are required to take their final examinations at the times and places scheduled. Conflicts may be resolved by arrangement with the faculty member. **Students having** three examinations scheduled for the same day **will be** considered **as having** a conflict. Alterations of officially scheduled times for examinations are likely to create inconvenience and hardship for students, and ill will toward the College; therefore, it is important that faculty adhere to the final examination schedule, and that no final examination be required of students except during examination week. It is also recognized by tThe College **also recognizes** that a final examination is an important part of the instructional process; therefore, in most instances, faculty are expected to provide students with some form of final examination.

Approved: January 20, 1993

#### Procedure

A final examination should be expected in each credit course at Parkland College. Final examinations for all full term courses credit courses with a scheduled end date on the last day of the semester are to be given during final exam week according to the official published schedule. Such final examinations are not to be given early during regular class periods. In courses where a final examination is not appropriate as determined by the department, an educational alternative scheduled during the week of final examinations is expected. Any requests from faculty to alter scheduled final examination times or dates must be reviewed and approved by the Department Cohair and the Vice President for Academic Services division dean. Final examinations for all credit courses less than a full-term in length with a scheduled end date that is earlier than the last day of the semester will be administered at the last scheduled class meeting.

#### **Procedures**

These waivers will be awarded under the following guidelines:

- Individual awards will be recommended by the coach and approved by the Athletic Director and the College President.
- 2. The terms of the offered award will be specifically designated in written contract form (NJCAA Letter of Intent) to be signed by the student, parent (if the student is under 18), coach and the appropriate College official.
- 3. If all the allocated full tuition and fee waivers are not used by a given sport, the Athletic Director may use his/her discretion in awarding the unused waiver to other sports for that current year. Candidates for the waiver must be eligible for regular College admission (following national eligibility rules) as a high school graduate or GED recipient. The tuition award is renewable each semester for a maximum of six full-time semesters, or until the student has completed his/her sophomore year of eligibility.
- 4. To continue in eligibility for renewal, the student must have passed a minimum of 12 hours of College course work during the previous full-time semester with a minimum "C" average. In addition, the student must be making reasonable progress toward a declared educational objective. Summer school hours may be used to make up deficiencies in spring credit hours and grade point average in order for the tuition waiver to be granted in the upcoming semester. Athletes who are not meeting academic progress will meet with the Athletic Director to determine continuation of the tuition waiver for the following semester.
- Students wanting to attend summer school and receive their award must follow the guidelines for eligibility renewal.
- The student will may lose the eligibility for renewal if he or she is in violation of the Student Conduct Code.
- 7. The College will not submit a request for chargeback for any out-of-district student enrolled with an approved scholarship.
- 7. Full tuition and fee waivers can be issued to in-district, out-of-district, and out-of-state to include international residents.
- 8. All in-state athletes will be required to submit the "Free Application for Federal Student Aid" (FAFSA). The College will not waive tuition and fees if the student athlete qualifies for funding under the Illinois Student Assistance Commission Monetary Award Program (MAP).

#### **POLICY 8.20 STUDENT ACTIVITY FUND**

The Student Activity Fund was established by the Board of Trustees to assist students in developing a student activity program within the resolution adopted by the Board for "Establishment of Student Organizations at Parkland College." The Board believes that a student activity program is helpful in providing maximum learning experiences for students in conjunction with the traditional academic classroom setting.

As a general policy, the College provides salaries for coaches, faculty and staff advisors, clerical staff, and administrators for the student activity program. Student Activity funds may be used for additional staff salaries to administer the Student Activity Program.

In an effort to formulateing a total comprehensive student activity program, the Student Activity Fund encompasses areas of concern for the total is utilized by the College community and to establishes a balanced series of programs and activities for the students. The Student Activity Fund budget is subject to approval by the Board of Trustees. The Fund is to be budgeted annually by the Director of Student Life, allocated for the operation of the following areas:

**Student and team activity** Intercollegiate funds are expended for continuance of individual and team activities including transportation, room and board, and participation of students in national competition. Drama and debate are financed by the Student Activity Fund, excluding capital equipment for the programs. These funds also finance a balanced series of student programming, activities, events, and functions.

Prospectus and Student Media activities Student Publications is are totally financed, including payments for services to the student staff members of the yearbook and newspaper via the Student Activity Fund.

Student Campus organizations activities include the operation of the interorganizational council and the allocation of funds to chartered and recognized campus organizations for program planning and organizational campus wide activities.

Intramurals is totally financed through the Student Activity Fund.

Commencement and End-Of-The-Year Programming Convocations and Student Services are partially financed by the Student Activity Fund., and a balanced series of social functions is provided as well as appropriate social activities and events.

Student Government and Leadership Academy expenditures are financed through the Student Activities Fund, including the equipment and supplies necessary for a student activity program, travel and conference expenses for student-related meetings, salaries for the Executive Board of Student Government, office operational expenses, district-wide service, and community projects directed by presently enrolled students, and other related sStudent-senate Government and Leadership Academy expenses.

Student Academic and Co-Curricular Supports include partial funding for peer-academic tutoring; licensing services for music used in the arts programs and the radio and the TV stations; CTE competition teams; and co-curricular student activities within the academic units.

Student transportation funds are used to purchase, maintain, and support the use of the college busses vehicles utilized for student transportation.

Loanable equipment funds are used to purchase and maintain items such as food service items, tablecloths, decorations, etc. utilized in part for student events and activities.

Unexpended monies of the Student Activity Fund may be set aside each year for "bonds," and held in reserve to be used for capital outlay items and/or services which enhance the Student Activity Program on the College campus. Such
