Building the Careers of Tomorrow

Helping others succeed in the building trades inspired Zelda Rhoden-Williams to teach at Parkland College. Now, she's making an impact in the Highway Construction Careers Training Program (HCCTP) and other Parkland courses.

"I enjoy witnessing students' excitement at the possibilities and opportunities to make a livable wage through the trades," she says. "My favorite class to facilitate is Communicating Effectively, because it is one of the most necessary skills needed to obtain meaningful careers and build healthy relationships."

Rhoden-Williams began her career as an Ameren meter reader and later served as a meter specialist in Champaign-Urbana and the surrounding communities. She was a proud member of International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local 51.

During this time, she actively volunteered in career discussions, sharing insights and promoting opportunities within the IBEW. She joined the HCCTP team in early 2022 after retiring with 30 years of service at Ameren Illinois.

"I enjoy working with students seeking careers and witnessing the light bulb moments when they find that path that excites them," she says. "I once participated in a 'Spiritual Gifts' series offered by our pastor, and one of my spiritual gifts was teaching. Go figure!"

Rhoden-Williams has grown significantly in her role at Parkland, gaining more confidence in public speaking, among other skills. She began by leading safety training, mentoring students on how to prepare for working in the challenging weather conditions of central Illinois.

She currently leads construction trade and job site tours and supports students with mock interviews and resume development. In 2024, she expanded her training expertise to instruction in Essential Workplace Skills courses, further enriching the student learning experience. Rhoden-Williams teaches these courses for many grant programs at Parkland, including the Support for Workforce Training (SWFT), Climate Equity Jobs Act (CEJA), and HCCTP.

"All of the Essential Workplace Skills courses [at Parkland] connect individuals of any professional background," she says. "The courses are a great reminder and refresher of ideas and solutions for greater self-accountability."

For anyone considering teaching at Parkland, Rhoden-Williams advises: "I would simply say, 'Go for it.' Working with students who are trying to navigate life and future career choices is very rewarding." —Noah Nelson


