Dates and Deadlines

July 30: If registered for these classes on or before July 30, tuition is due in full, or a payment plan or financial aid needs to be in place.

For classes that begin the week of September 9

Course Drops and Withdrawals

Student-Initiated Drop

To drop a class with no record and receive a refund, students must either drop the class online by the Sunday following the first day of class, OR go to Admissions and Records, U214, by the Friday following the first day of class. No refunds are given for withdrawing from a class after those deadlines.

Student-Initiated Withdrawal

Students may withdraw from any class until 5pm on the last business day of the week before the last week of instruction (this does not include final exam week). Withdrawing after the first week of class results in a "W" grade on the transcript and no refund will be given.

To withdraw, a student should speak with the instructor, department chair, or program director to request their signature on the withdrawal form. A student must withdraw in person at Admissions and Records in U214, by emailing the form to admissions@parkland. edu, or by mailing in a "Withdraw from Classes" form (download at www.parkland.edu/forms) before the deadline. Note that changing your class schedule may affect financial aid. Please check with the Office of Financial Aid and Veteran Services, U286, prior to making schedule changes or withdrawing from classes. Failing to withdraw properly may result in receiving a failing grade of F for that class.

Student Requests for Late Withdrawal

- A student may appeal a grade to the dean of learning support in cases where F grades have been recorded because the student was unable to officially withdraw.
- A student may petition the dean of learning support for a medical withdrawal from any and all courses in a semester.

Faculty-Initiated (Administrative) Withdrawals

At the census day immediately following the student drop period, faculty will initiate the administrative withdrawal process for students who have never attended. After the census date and at any time up until midterm, faculty will initiate the administrative withdrawal process for students who have ceased to attend. Attendance in an online class is measured in terms of student participation in online class discussions or contact with the faculty member.

Faculty are required to certify students' attendance at midterm. After midterm, faculty cannot withdraw any student; withdrawal from a class must be done by the student prior to the withdrawal deadlines. All faculty-initiated withdrawals result in a W grade on the permanent academic record. No refunds are given.

Additional Course Information

Critical Comprehension Skills (CCS)

CCS courses focus on reading and study skills essential for college success. Students enrolling for the first time in a course requiring college-level reading skills must first take the reading assessment. They will be placed in a CCS course or be exempt based on their performance on the test. Students who have appropriate standardized test scores, such as ACT or SAT, or who are transferring credit in two reading-intensive courses, will be placed directly into college-level reading classes without taking the Parkland assessment test. English 102 Options

Parkland College offers two options of research-based composition (ENG 102): Liberal Arts Sections and Career-Oriented Sections. Both options fulfill freshman composition requirements for all Parkland College degree programs, and both transfer to other colleges and universities.

Liberal Arts Sections of ENG 102 (the even-numbered sections) are a good choice for students majoring in humanities, arts, and social science fields, especially those who plan to complete a bachelor's degree and perhaps continue on to graduate or professional school. In liberal arts sections of ENG 102, students practice the skills required in academic research-based writing, including analysis, synthesis, interpretation, and evaluation of information and points of view from a variety of print and electronic sources. In several shorter research-based essays during the first part of the course, students develop the skills required for the longer research paper completed later in the course.

Career-Oriented Sections of ENG 102 (the odd-numbered sections) are a good choice for students who plan careers in business, technical, and scientific fields, as well as some other careers such as law enforcement and health professions. In career-oriented sections of ENG 102, students practice the kinds of writing used in the workplace such as memoranda, business letters, proposals, and formal reports. Students research topics through a variety of methods and sources to develop the skills required for the final extended research paper.

Math Assessment

Parkland College is committed to helping students achieve success in their coursework. In this effort, the college has designed a math assessment program to aid students in selecting the most appropriate math course while taking into account their widely varied math backgrounds. For more information, see parkland.edu/assessment.

- Assessment or credit in the list prerequisite course is required prior to registering in any math course.
- Assessment scores are valid for only two years; thereafter, the student must be reassessed.
- Students with transfer credit in math are not required to take the assessment but can be placed in courses based on math credits earned within the last five years (after a review of transcripts).
- Online/hybrid math classes are a convenient option but are not a good first choice for everyone. Consider an online/hybrid class if you are organized, manage your time well, and learn math well in an independent format. Previous experience with the online classes is highly recommended prior to taking an online math course. Some on-campus or proctored off-campus testing is required.

Computer Technology Center

Learn computers at your own pace: Word, Excel, Access, PowerPoint, computer basics, web technology, and more! Take classes online or in a supervised computer lab.




Using the "Find a Class" Feature


- 1. Go to www.parkland.edu


