## Parkland College Occupational Therapy Assistant Program Plans for Becoming a Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant

The Parkland College Occupational Therapy Assistant Program provides quality education and over 1400 hours of "hands on" experience through its structured, sequenced curriculum. Courses are taught in a specific order, one time per year. Courses in the fall semester function as pre-requisites to courses in the spring semester. Different students may need different types of schedules while they go to school. Here are some options for you to consider when you are planning to be a student in the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program.

<u>PLAN A Full-time Student</u>: On this plan you would finish in 2 years (4 semesters). You would be in school often 20 hours or more per week. Add study time and this would be equivalent to a 40+ hour per week job. The summer courses are optional.
