

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- I. Out of 919 graduates of occupational programs contacted in the 2010-2011 Student Occupational Follow-Up Survey, 412 responded (response rate of 44.8%).
- II. PROFILE OF OUR OCCUPATIONAL GRADUATES:
 - Females outnumber males 59% to 41%.
 - More than 7 out of 10 are White *:
 - 72.3% are White.
 - 9.0% are Black or African American.
 - 4.2% are Hispanic or Latino.
 - 2.6% are Asian.
 - 1.8% are International students.
 - 0.2% are American Indian/Alaskan Native.
 - 0.2% are Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander.
 - The age of graduates ranges from 16 to 65, with a mean age of 28 years.
- III. OUTCOMES OF OUR OCCUPATIONAL GRADUATES:
 - **83.0%** report they are **employed**, an increase of 1.1% from last year.
 - 65.7% full-time** (5.1% increase).
 - 17.3% part-time** (4.0% increase).
 - **94.1%** of those employed work **in Illinois**, a increase of 0.3% from last year.
 - 70.5% in-district (9.3% increase).
 - 23.9% outside district (10.6% decrease).
 - 66.1% began their present job after leaving the college program, 19.3% while enrolled, and 14.6% before entering the program.
 - **74.7%** are employed in a **career related to their field** of study, a decrease of 3.3% from last year.
 - Out of 338 respondents, **86.4%** reported they were very or somewhat **satisfied with their current job**, an increase of 1.6% from last year.
 - The **average hourly salary was \$15.54**, a decrease of \$2.11 from last year. The average salary was \$1.03 higher for females (\$15.92 per hour) than for males (\$14.89 per hour). This is a decrease from last year, when females earned \$1.79 more than males.

 - Satisfaction ratings for all 6 items in the major program were high with the majority feeling somewhat or very satisfied with course content (95.6%); equipment, facilities, materials (93.6%); lectures/lab (92.1%); job preparation (90.7%); preparation for further education (87.3%); and information on current employment (75.5%). Satisfaction ratings for preparation for further education increased from the previous year.
 - Among the users of services, the percentage feeling somewhat to very satisfied ranged from 96.9% to 72.2%:
 - Student services:** admissions (91.1%); assessment (88.8%); student activities (85.9%); career planning (83.7%); college transfer planning (80.2%); counseling (79.2%); financial aid (76.0%); and job placement (73.7%).
 - Academic services:** library/audio visual (94.8%); learning lab (93.5%); college tutoring (90.1%); and faculty advising (79.8%).
 - College services:** cashier (93.4%); bookstore (87.7%); parking (81.3%); and food service (74.5%).
 - 74.7% agreed or strongly agreed that their experience at **Parkland improved their abilities** to solve problems, while 54.3% indicated improvement in writing, 54.0% in speaking, 52.1% in doing math, and 45.8% in reading.

INTRODUCTION

The Parkland College Occupational Follow-Up Survey was administered to the Class of 2010-2011 by the Department of Institutional Accountability & Research (IAR) and the Career Center.

Methodology

IAR was responsible for the initial distribution of the e-mail and paper mail surveys. The Career Center conducted follow-up surveys by telephone. Nine hundred and nineteen (919) graduates of occupational programs (including short term certificates) were initially contacted with an e-mail survey approximately eight months after graduation, followed by a second e-mail attempt. Non-respondents were mailed a paper survey approximately three weeks later, followed by a second mailing. The Career Center contacted the remaining non-respondents and conducted the survey by telephone. This approach generated a response rate of 44.8%. IAR was responsible for data entry, analysis and reporting.

Results

Data are presented in the following tables on rates of graduate employment, meeting college objectives, hourly salary, and satisfaction with current job, major and outside major program areas, student services, academic services and college services. Graduate demographic information by degree program appears in Tables 4-6. Employment data by program is contained in Tables 7-7E. Hourly salary outcomes are located in Tables 8-10B. Graduate satisfaction with Parkland programs and services are numbered Tables 11-20, with graduate satisfaction outcomes by gender, ethnicity and age group contained in Tables 18-20A. Satisfaction rates with current job are presented in Table 17, and hourly salary by satisfaction in Table 21. A listing of the employers of Parkland graduates is contained in Table 22. Tables 23-24 reflect perceptions of Parkland's contribution to graduates' improvement in reading, writing, speaking, doing math, and solving problems.
