

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- I. Out of 441 graduates contacted in the 2010-2011 Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up Survey, 231 returned surveys (response rate of 52.4%).
- II. PROFILE OF OUR TRANSFER GRADUATES:
 - There were more female (60.3%) than male (39.7%) graduates.
 - More than 7 out of 10 graduates of the baccalaureate/transfer programs are White*:

White	70.3%
Black or African American	9.1%
Hispanic or Latino	5.0%
Asian	3.4%
International students	2.5%
American Indian/Alaskan Native	0.0%

- 55.1% of the graduates were in Associate in Science (AS) programs, 29.5% in Associate in Arts (AA) programs, 12.9% in Associate in General Studies (AGS) programs, 1.8% in Fine Arts (AFA) programs, and 0.1% in Associate in Engineering Science (AES) programs.
- Graduates ranged in age from 18 to 60 and most (71.0%) were under 25 years old.

III. OUTCOMES:

- 84.4% attended Parkland with the intent to transfer to a 4 year university/college.
- 81.8% indicated that they will enroll in a 4-year institution the following semester.
- Satisfaction rates for most major program areas were high: between 98.4% and 75.0% feel very or somewhat satisfied in:

- More graduates reported that they transferred to the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign (22.8%), Eastern Illinois University (18.5%), and to Illinois State University (15.9%) than to the 17 other in-state (20.6%) and 10 out-of-state (10.1%) reported institutions (12.2% did not report the name of the institution to which they would be transferring).
- 81.2% agreed or strongly agreed that their experience at Parkland improved their abilities in solving problems, while 78.9% indicated improvement in writing, 76.2% in speaking, 69.5% in doing math, and 59.6% in reading.

PARKLAND COLLEGE TRANSFER PROGRAM GRADUATE FOLLOW-UP SURVEY CLASS OF 2010-2011

Introduction

The Parkland College Transfer Follow-Up Survey was administered to the Class of 2010-2011 by the Department of Institutional Accountability & Research (IAR) and the Career Center.

Methodology

The Career Center and a faculty advisory committee developed the survey instrument from the Student Occupational Follow-Up Survey questionnaire. In this study, graduates were asked questions that were pertinent only to the baccalaureate/transfer programs.

IAR was responsible for the initial distribution of the e-mail and paper mail surveys. The Career Center conducted follow-up surveys by telephone. Four hundred and forty one (441) graduates of <u>baccalaureate/transfer</u> programs were initially contacted with an e-mail survey approximately eight months after graduation, followed by a second e-mail attempt. Non-respondents were mailed a paper survey approximately three weeks later, followed by a second mailing. The Career Center contacted the remaining non-respondents and conducted the survey by telephone. This approach generated a response rate of 52.4%. IAR was responsible for data entry, analysis and reporting.

Results

Data are presented in Table 1 on response rates by academic program. Table 6 presents a summary of students' objectives in attending college. Data by gender, ethnicity and age group are compiled in Tables 2-5 and 7-9. Tables 10-19 present results on students' objective in attending college; planned objective for the next semester; and satisfaction ratings on major and outside major program of study, student services, academic services, and college services. Table 20 provides the names of the institutions to which students plan to transfer. Tables 21-22 reflect perceptions of Parkland's contribution to graduates' improvement in reading, writing, speaking, doing math, and solving problems.
