

Introduction

The Parkland College Transfer Follow-Up Survey was administered to the Class of 2014-2015 by the Department of Institutional Accountability & Research (IAR).

Methodology

IAR was responsible for the distribution of the e-mail, paper mail surveys and follow-up surveys by telephone. Three hundred and twenty one (321) graduates of baccalaureate/transfer programs were initially contacted with an e-mail survey approximately eight months after graduation, followed by a follow-up a second email attempt one week later and several reminders after that. Non-respondents were mailed a paper survey approximately two weeks after the second email, followed by a second mailing one month later. The remaining non-respondents were contacted by telephone. This approach generated a response rate of 30.2%. Most participants responded to surveys sent through non-Parkland email (61.9%), followed by paper mailing (22.7%) and Parkland email (15.5%). IAR was responsible for data entry, analysis and reporting.

Results

Data are presented in Table 1 on response rates by academic program. Table 6 presents a summary of students' objectives in attending college. Data by gender, ethnicity and age group are compiled in Tables 2-5 and 7-9. Tables 10-19 present results on students' objective in attending college; planned objective for the next semester; and satisfaction ratings on major and outside major program of study, student services, academic services, and college services. Table 20 provides the names of the institutions to which students plan to transfer. Tables 21-22 reflect perceptions of Parkland's contribution to graduates' improvement in reading, writing, speaking, doing math, and solving problems.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- I. Out of 321 graduates contacted in the 2014-2015 Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up, 30.2% (97) responded. Most participants responded through non-Parkland email (61.9%), 22.7% through paper mail and 15.5% through Parkland email.
- II. PROFILE OF OUR TRANSFER GRADUATES:
 - There were more female (56.7%) than male (43.3%) graduates.
 - More than 7 out of 10 graduates of the baccalaureate/transfer programs are White*:

Black or African American	9.7%
Hispanic or Latino	6.5%
Asian	3.1%
Non-Resident Alien	0.3%
American Indian/Alaskan Native	0.3%

- 54.8% of the graduates were in Associate in Science (AS) programs, 24.9% in Associate in Arts (AA) programs, 14.3% in Associate in General Studies (AGS) programs, 3.7% in Fine Arts (AFA) programs, and 2.2% in Associate in Engineering Science (AES) programs.
- Graduates ranged in age from 19 to 59 and most (70.7%) were under 25 years old.

III. OUTCOMES:

- 74.2% attended Parkland with the intent to transfer to a 4 year university/college.
- 70.1% indicated that they enrolled in a 4-year institution after graduating from Parkland.
- 84.5% reported being employed**. Of those employed, 78.3% were employed full-time**.
- Satisfaction rates for most major program areas were high: between 97.8% and 78.8% feel very or somewhat satisfied in:

- Graduates reported that they transferred to the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign (23.5%), Eastern Illinois University (25.0%), and to Illinois State University (22.1%) than to the 9 other in-state (19.1%) and 5 out-of-state (7.4%) reported institutions (2.9% did not report the name of the institution to which they would be transferring).
- 83.9% agreed or strongly agreed that their experience at Parkland improved their abilities in solving problems, while 81.5% in speaking, 80.6% indicated improvement in writing, 72.8% in doing math, and 64.5% in reading.


