

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

I. Out of 534 graduates contacted in the 2007-2008 <u>Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up Survey</u>, 231 returned surveys (<u>response rate of 49.3%</u>).

II. PROFILE OF OUR TRANSFER GRADUATES:

- There were more female (53.3%) than male (46.7%) graduates.
- More than 8 out of 10 graduates of the baccalaureate/transfer programs are White:

Black, non-Hispanic	9.0%
International students	4.1%
Hispanic	2.1%
Asian/Pacific Islander	2.3%
American Indian/Alaskan Native	0.4%

- 53.5% of the graduates were in AS programs, 31.1% in AA degree programs, 11.9% in AGS programs, 2.1% in AFA programs, and 1.3% in AES programs.
- Graduates ranged in age from 19 to 52, and most (68.2%) were under 25 years old.

III. OUTCOMES:

- 85.2% attended Parkland with an intent to transfer to a 4 year university/college.
- 79.5% indicated that they **will enroll** in the **following semester**.
- Satisfaction rates for most major program areas were high: between 99.2% and 64.9% feel very or somewhat satisfied in:

Among Users,

- More graduates reported they transferred to the <u>University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign</u> (13.4%), <u>Illinois State University</u> (7.9%), and to <u>Eastern Illinois University</u> (7.2%) than to the other 22 in-state and 12 out-of-state reported institutions.
- 74.9% agreed or strongly agreed that their experience at **Parkland improved their abilities in writing**, while 73.0% indicated improvement in solving problems, 69.0% in speaking, 66.5% in doing math, and 55.0.% in reading.

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PARKLAND COLLEGE TRANSFER PROGRAM GRADUATE FOLLOW-UP SURVEY CLASS OF 2007-2008

Introduction

The Parkland College Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up Survey was administered to the Class of 2007-2008 by Institutional Accountability & Research (IAR) and the Career Center (CC).

Methodology

CC and a faculty advisory committee developed the survey instrument from the Student Occupational Follow-Up Survey questionnaire. In this study, graduates were asked questions that were pertinent only to the baccalaureate/transfer programs.

IAR was responsible for mailing and CC for following up on surveys. The combined efforts generated a response rate of 49.3%. Four hundred sixty nine (469) graduates of <u>baccalaureate/transfer programs</u> were initially contacted approximately six weeks after graduation. Non-respondents were mailed a second survey three weeks later. The remaining non-respondents were contacted by telephone calls starting three weeks following the second mailing.

IAR was responsible for data entry, analysis and reporting.

Results

Data are presented in Table 1 on response rates and Tables 10-20 on students' objective in attending college; planned objective for the next semester; satisfaction ratings on major and outside major program of study, student services, academic and college services; perceptions of Parkland's contribution to graduate improvement; and the name of the institution to which they plan to transfer. Data by gender, ethnicity and age group are compiled in Tables 2-9. Tables 21 and 22 reflect perceptions of Parkland's contribution to graduates' improvement in reading, writing, speaking, doing math, and solving problems.
