


EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Out of 503 graduates contacted in the 2008-2009 Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up Survey, 223 returned surveys Ι. (response rate of 44.3%).
- II. PROFILE OF OUR TRANSFER GRADUATES:
 - There were more female (58.1%) than male (41.9%) graduates. •
 - More than 8 out of 10 graduates of the baccalaureate/transfer programs are White:

Asian/Pacific Islander	2.4%

- 49.9% of the graduates were in Associate in Science (AS) programs, 32.6% in Associate in Arts (AA) programs, 12.9% in Associate in General Studies (AGS) programs, 2.4% in Associate in Engineering Science (AES) programs, and 2.2% in Associate in Fine Arts (AFA) programs.
- Graduates ranged in age from 19 to 57, and most (69.4%) were under 25 years old. ٠

III. OUTCOMES:

- 82.5% attended Parkland with the intent to transfer to a 4 year university/college. .
- 79.8% indicated that they will enroll in the following semester. •
- Satisfaction rates for most major program areas were high: between 98.6% and 76.6% feel very or somewhat satisfied in: • •

- More graduates reported that they transferred to the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign (28.4%), Eastern Illinois University (24.3%), and to Illinois State University (16.0%) than to the 11 other in-state (19.5%) and 13 out-of-state (7.7%) institutions. (The remaining 4.1% of students were undecided or did not report their institution.) •
- 84.3% agreed or strongly agreed that their experience at Parkland improved their abilities in solving problems, while • 79.3% indicated improvement in writing, 78.7% in speaking, 75.5% in doing math, and 59.4% in reading.

PARKLAND COLLEGE TRANSFER PROGRAM GRADUATE FOLLOW-UP SURVEY CLASS OF 2008-2009

Introduction

The Parkland College Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up Survey was administered to the Class of 2008-2009 by the Department of Institutional Accountability and Research (IAR) and the Career Center.

Methodology

The Career Center and a faculty advisory committee developed the self-report survey instrument from the Student Occupational Follow-Up Survey questionnaire. In this study, graduates were asked questions that were pertinent only to the baccalaureate/transfer programs.

IAR was responsible for initial distribution of the e-mail and mail surveys. The Career Center conducted follow-up surveys by telephone. The combined efforts generated a response rate of 44.3%. Five hundred and three (503) graduates of <u>baccalaureate/transfer programs</u> were initially contacted with an e-mail survey approximately six weeks after graduation. Non-respondents were mailed a paper survey approximately three weeks later, followed by a second mailing. The Career Center contacted the remaining non-respondents, conducted the survey by phone, and recorded the responses. IAR was responsible for data entry, analysis and reporting.

Results

Table 1 contains response rates by academic program. Table 6 presents a summary of students' objectives in attending college. Data by gender, ethnicity and age group are compiled in Tables 2-5 and 7-9. Tables 10-20 present results on students' objective in attending college; planned objective for the next semester; and satisfaction ratings on major and outside major program of study, student services, academic and college services. Table 20 provides the names of the institutions to which students plan to transfer. Tables 21-22 reflect perceptions of Parkland's contribution to graduates' improvement in reading, writing, speaking, doing math, and solving problems.
