### ADMISSION FORM for INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

### **ALL APPLICANTS**

International students currently outside the U.S., visa-holders, and pending permanent residents should complete this International Student Admission Form and return it to International Admissions in room U233. Please refer to deadlines at the top of page 3 of the admissions form.

Note: A \$50 non-refundable fee is required for F-1 applicants.

**Permanent residents and citizens** should complete a Parkland College Admission Form and return it to the Admissions Office.

**Note for University of Illinois concurrent enrollment students:** In addition to Parkland admission materials, UIUC concurrent enrollment students must have a Concurrent Enrollment Form and a copy of their UIUC transcript/Academic History.

Degree-seeking students must submit a copy of all official secondary school completion certificates and /or transcript and any post-secondary transcripts. Records not issued in English must be accompanied by an English translation that is certified by an appropriate school official, official translator, or U.S. embassy or consulate official. The transcript must indicate that the applicant has completed the equivalent of U.S. secondary education (minimum 12 years of education).

**Nondegree-seeking students** who hold other visa designations like F-2, H, J, L, E, or R need only to complete this form and present a current passport, visa, I-94, and related immigration documents to be admitted to Parkland College.

**Degree- and nondegree-seeking students,** must demonstrate English language proficiency by one of the following:

- TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score; minimum scores for academic course work are 61 ibT/500 pbT
- 2. Parkland's assessment test (testing after arrival)
- 3. Bachelor's degree in a country where English is the official language and medium of instruction

Applicants who need additional language training will attend precollege ESL (English as a Second Language) classes.

### **Health Careers**

Health career programs at Parkland College are selective. Students must be admitted to the college prior to admission to the health career program. For more information concerning the requirements and deadlines, call the Health Professions department at 217/351-2224.

If you are having someone else pick up your admission documents, please send us an original signed letter giving your permission or complete the Permission to Release Admission Documents (form attached).

### F-1 APPLICANTS

F-1 applicants obtaining a visa outside the U.S. need to submit a \$50 (fifty U.S. dollars) non-refundable admission fee. If you bank outside the U.S., payment should be in the form of a cashier's check or money order (*not* a personal check) in U.S. dollars, made out to Parkland College. Students who have bank accounts in the U.S. may provide a personal check.

If you need an F-1 student visa to enter the U.S., financial certification is required. U.S. immigration regulations require the original signature of your sponsor, either on a letter of sponsorship, or on the Financial Verification Form. An official bank statement or letter showing sufficient funds for at least one year of study is also required. Neither photocopies nor facsimile copies of any of these documents are acceptable. The account holder name on the bank statement must match the name of your sponsor as listed on the admission form or sponsor letter. The statement must also be written in English or accompanied by a certified English translation.

If you have F-1 immigration status and are transferring from another school in the U.S., request that your international student advisor at your current school release your I-20 in the SEVIS system to Parkland College so that Parkland can issue you an I-20 for attendance at Parkland. Your current school may require a copy of your admission letter to Parkland.

## A special message about deadlines for F-1 students applying outside the U.S.

It is very important that you allow enough time to acquire the F-1 visa at a U.S. consulate or embassy office. Although you may meet our deadline for admission, it is possible that this will not allow enough time to apply and interview for the visa. Plan ahead! Complete admission files require one to two weeks of processing time. If we send you the admission materials — including I-20 — by express mail, it may take as long as two weeks to reach you. Then you must pay the SEVIS I-901 fee three days before the visa interview. It is strongly recommended that you check the website of the closest U.S. embassy or consulate office to find current expected visa wait times. Do not wait until the last minute!

F-1 students should plan to arrive in Champaign/Urbana a minimum of two weeks before the beginning of the semester. When you arrive at Parkland College, you will attend an orientation session, check in to International Admissions, and take placement tests in Parkland's Assessment Center. Once you have received your assessment results, an advisor will help you choose classes and register.
