Your Name Constellation

Constellations are pictures made from connecting the stars with imaginary lines. The pictures are often used in myths and legends - star stories that we still use today.

In this activity, students will use their own names to position the stars for their very own constellations, then draw a constellation from those stars and write a description or story about the picture.


Directions:

2. For each name letter, follow along the row to the right and draw a star in the square below the matching letter.

3. Look at the stars and find a pattern. Hold the paper up, down, sideways if it helps to imagine a picture.

4. Connect the stars and draw a picture of your new constellation.
