Failure to complete the listed prerequisite coursework in the Transfer Handbook (<https://admissions.illinois.edu/Apply/Transfer/handbook>) may result in a student's denial of admission to a particular degree of study. 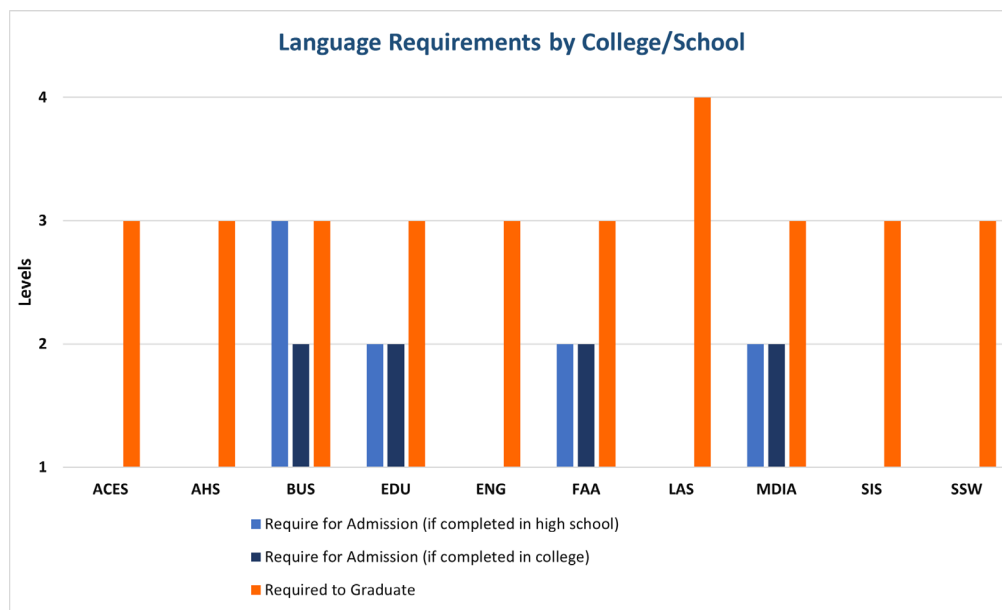
